We hope that no parent will ever receive a phone call as a result of a car wreck. The picture says it all. We'd like to help. Help your students to become prevention-conscious, conscientious drivers.

The World Health Organization now terms the global toll of damage, injury and crash fatalities, "Unintentional Violence". . . defined, not as an "accident", but most often as a result of some sort of mistake or error. This is an economic issue, a health issue and can be, to any one of us, a personal issue.

You can provide our students and school system with an informational presentation concentrating on this subject. These are our kids.

This presentation fits into a normal school schedule, in assemblies or smaller group settings. The powerpoint punctuates the facts and importance.

Small mistakes, big consequences. "It happens 'all-of-a sudden' however unintentional or inadvertent. "This is, for most, the first time in a student's life where errors can lead to such profound consequences. Science treats everybody equally in a car."

Driving is kinetically and statistically the most dangerous adult activity, an activity for which there is precious little preparation and training. Indeed, any person who ever crashed a car or has had their car crashed in to, passed their DMV driver's test. The test is not a deterrent. Why not provide only a bit more than the cursory requirements of that DMV test?

You can schedule a day of "Teen Driver Safety Awareness" for your school. In the past eight years, Bob Green has made presentations to over 65,000 students about this critical issue. The Connecticut Valley Region, Porsche Club of America and Lime Rock Park, as a community service, will sponsor more than 12 Connecticut high schools.
